- **April 2 – Plan it Right! Seed, Seedlings, & More** – (Meet in Bluemont Room, 2nd floor) Plant your seeds and seedlings so they'll happily grow for you, and learn when and how to start seedlings from experienced gardeners.
- **April 16 – Tomato Love** – (Meet in Quincy Room) Tomatoes are a popular crop in home gardens. Learn how you can grow and maintain tomatoes to make the most of your crop.
- **May 7 – Herbs – Planning, Planting** (Meet in Bluemont Room, 2nd floor) Fresh herbs can take your cooking from good to great. There are herbs for all cuisines and growing conditions. Which will you grow? How do you grow them? Where do they fit with your vegetables?
- **May 21 – Gardening Structures** – Easy-to-build garden structures help you save garden space, grow healthier plants, bring higher yields.
